

IMPACT OF PUPIL PREMIUM SPENDING ON ATTAINMENT 2016-17

The achievement of Pupil Premium (PP) and non Pupil Premium pupils has been substantially improved for those taking GCSEs at Witton Park. The tables below compare the achievement of pupils at Witton Park and pupils nationally. Until 2015 the Pupil Premium pupils at Witton Park were well above the national average for Pupil Premium in the 5A*-C inc English and Maths measure. The national issue with the English iGCSE qualification impacted negatively on performance of Pupil Premium pupils in 2014-15. Outcomes for 2015-16 and 2016-17 have now demonstrated sustained improvement in attainment and progress of pupil premium pupils.

For the academic year 2015-16 the government changed the accountability framework. Overall school progress is now measured using 'Progress 8' measure. Again our Pupil Premium pupils compare favourably to both national data and also compared to their peers.

The score of +0.40 for Pupil Premium pupils means that our Pupil Premium cohort achieve nearly a full half a grade better than all pupils nationally. This is an outstanding achievement and is likely to outperform other pupils nationally (non pupil premium pupils) this will be confirmed
